


The General Conception of Justice

“All social values—liberty and opportunity, income and wealth, and the social bases of self-respect—are to be distributed equally unless an unequal distribution of any, or all, of these values is to everyone’s advantage.”

<u>Primary Goods</u>	<u>Principles of Justice</u>
Liberties	<p>First Principle</p> <p>Each person is to have an equal right to the most extensive total system of liberties compatible with a similar system of liberty for all.</p>
Opportunities	<p>Second Principle</p> <p>Social and economic inequalities are to be arranged so that they are both:</p> <p>(b) attached to offices and positions open to all under conditions of fair equality of opportunity</p>
Income & wealth	<p>(a) to the greatest benefit of the least advantaged</p>
